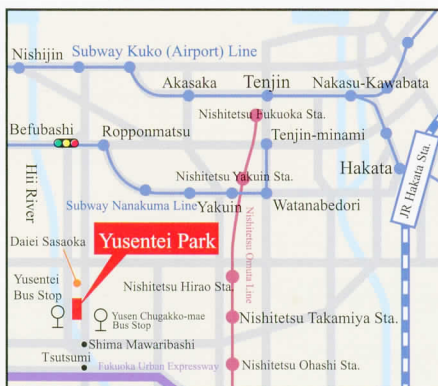

### Transportation

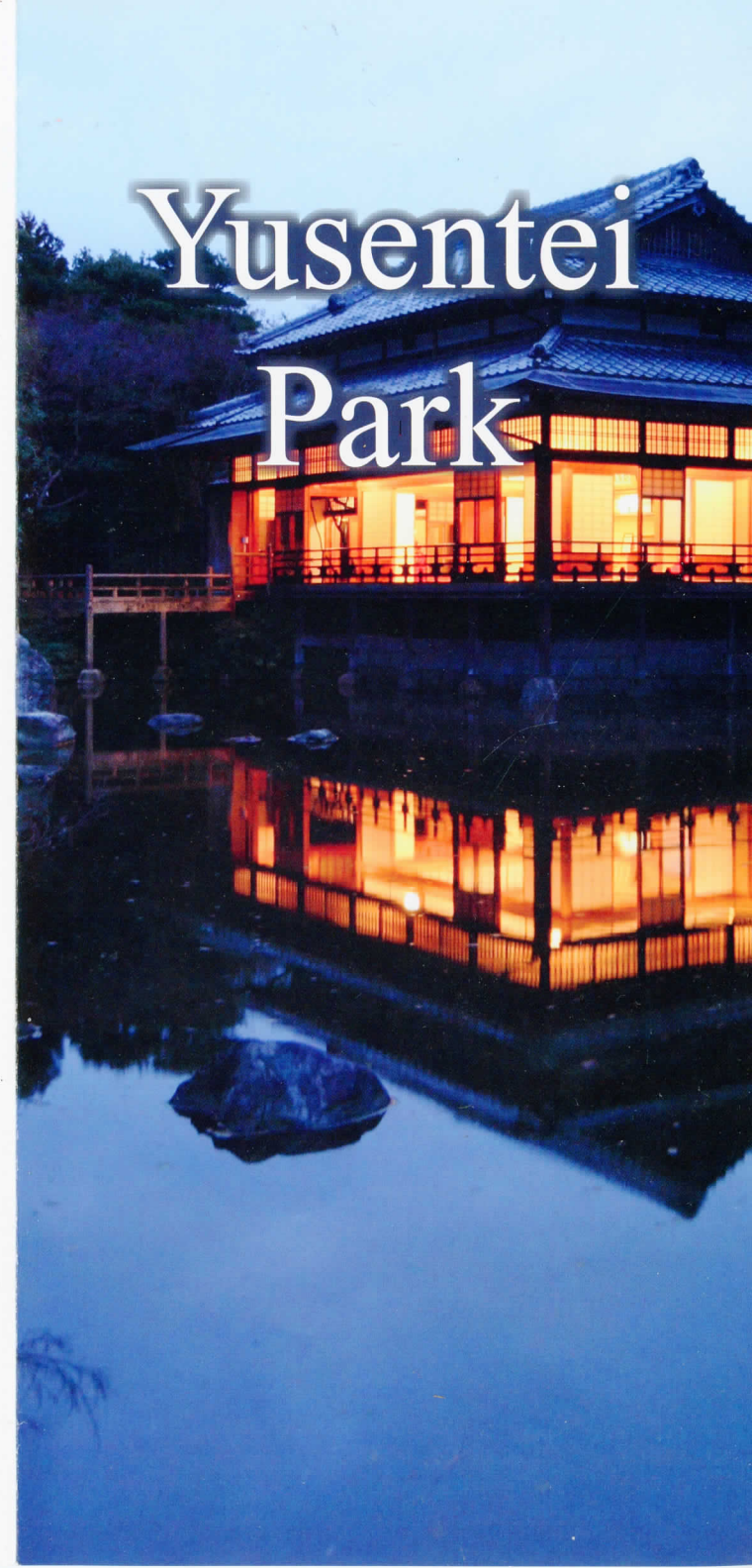
- By Nishitetsu Bus
  - Bus no.12 from Tenjin/Hakata Station  
Get off at Yusentei stop. Approx. 5-min. walks.
  - Bus no.13/16/113 from Hakata Station  
Get off at Yusentei Chugakko-mae stop. Approx. 10-min. walks.
- By Car
  - Departure from Tenjin via Keyakidori Avenue, Ropponmatsu. Turn left at "Befubashi" intersection. Drive 1 km along Hii River. On the left, about 100 meters after Daiei Sasaoka shopping center.
- By Subway Nanakuma Line
  - 25-min. walks from Ropponmatsu Station.

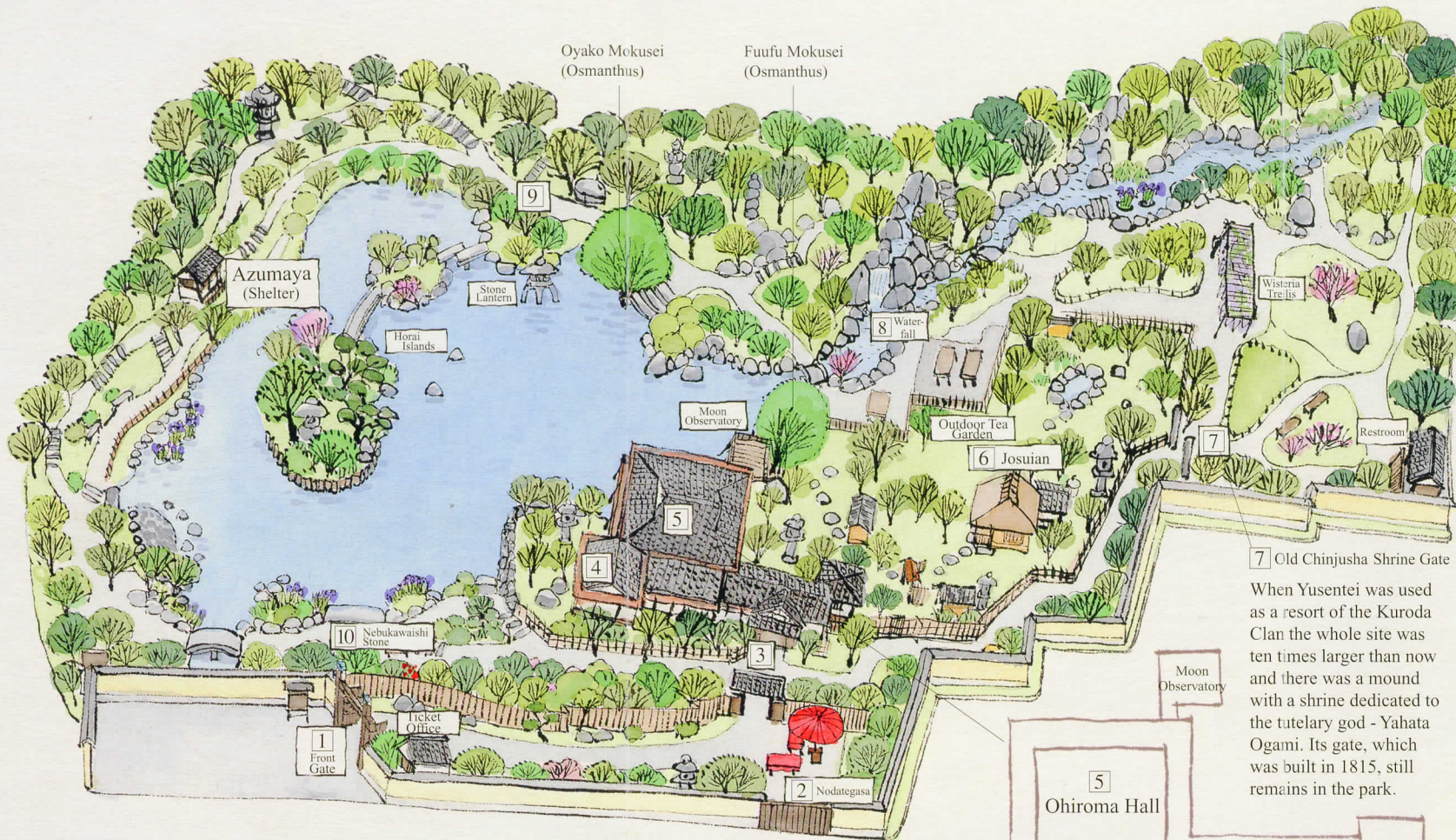

# Yusentei Park

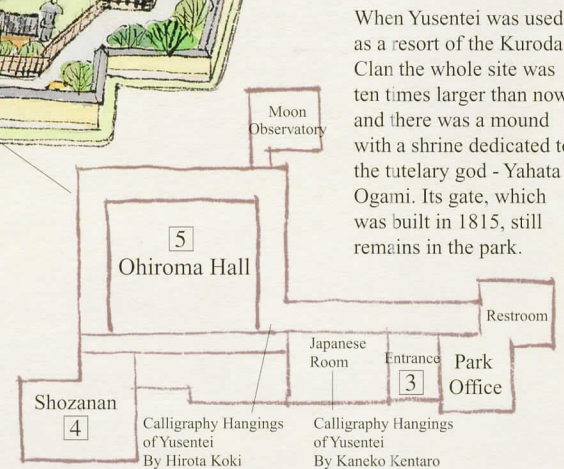
Yusentei was built in 1754 (around mid-Edo period) as a resort of Kuroda Tsugutaka, the 6th lord of the Kuroda Clan. It went through a restoration and then opened to the public as the first Chisen Kaiyu styled Japanese garden in Fukuoka City. In March 1998, it became the designated tourist spot in Fukuoka City. Since then numerous visitors has been to this historical park to experience absolute serenity. The name Yusentei derives from a classical poem by Minamoto Michinatsu, which can be roughly translated as follows: Away from the unbearable heat of summer, water sprung from fountain (Sen) nurtures friendships (Yu) at this house (Tei).



**1 Front Gate**  
A Kabukimon gate (gate with crossbar) for the entrance.

**2 Nodategasa** (parasol for outdoor tea ceremony)  
At the end of the entrance path, you will find a red parasol and benches covered with red felt. You can have your matcha at here as well.

**4 Shozanan**  
This is a tea ceremony room of about 13m<sup>2</sup> (8 tatami mats), named after Kuroda Tsugutaka's Buddhist name: Shozan Douzen Koji.



When Yusentei was used as a resort of the Kuroda Clan the whole site was ten times larger than now and there was a mound with a shrine dedicated to the tutelary god - Yahata Ogami. Its gate, which was built in 1815, still remains in the park.



**5 Ohiroma Hall**  
The 29m<sup>2</sup> (17.5 tatami mats) room facing a pond is constructed in Shoinzukuri style, which reflects the formal lifestyle of samurai.



**6 Josui'an**  
The name Josui'an was taken from Kuroda Josui, one of the ancestors of the Kuroda Clan. This 7.5m<sup>2</sup> (4.5 tatami mats) authentic tea ceremony room is isolated and surrounded by bamboos and trees. A rare ancient stone lantern is only a few steps away.

**8 Waterfall**  
The water falling from the fountain attracts many tourists. It enriches the pond and calms the viewer's soul.



**9** The view from the stone lantern beside Horai Islands Horai Island, located around the center of the pond, has two isles. The larger isle is likened to crane, and the smaller one is likened to turtle. Take a perfect photo of the Ohiroma hall from the lantern here.



**10 Nebukawaishi Stone**  
This stone was donated by the Kuroda Family and it was moved from their mansion in Tokyo to here. It is high quality granite called 'Kiseki Anzangan' (pyroxene andesite) from Odawara, Kanagawa, and very little of which is currently produced.
