













aratsu ware is a historic, traditional art handed down for years. The production of Karatsu ware is believed to have started around the 1580s in the territory of the Hata, the lord of Kishitake Castle, Later, the production volume of Karatsu ware was increased by adopting techniques from Korean potters who immigrated to Japan after the Korean Campaigns of Toyotomi

Hideyoshi. Karatsu ware spread to Kyoto, Osaka, and other areas in Western Japan. It became so popular that all styles of pottery were called "Karatsu-mono." Karatsu ware was also popular among the masters of the tea ceremony - as their old saying goes: "first,

Ido; second, Raku; and third, Karatsu

Now, 70 or more pottery factories are interspersed around Karatsu, creating their own styles of Karatsu ware by getting inspiration from the innovative styles of contemporary artists.



E Karatsu

Karatsu ware is known as the first painted pottery in Japan. E-Karatsu is a typical traditional style of Karatsu ware, pained with iron oxide paints called "oni-ita" and glazed with a transparent glaze. Various types of Karatsu ware works are adorned with beautiful paintings. They come in a variety of patterns, ranging from flowers and plants

Madara Karatsu

Madara Karatsu is a style of Karatsu ware which uses It is named after its characteristic blue and black mottled pattern created by the melting of the iron contained in the clay and the pine ash from the firewood. This traditional style of Karatsu ware has been produced since the late 16th century.

A historical heritage handed down for more than 400 years

Kuro Karatsu

Kuro-Karatsu is a style of Karatsu ware which uses an iron-rich glaze. Depending on the content of iron and the level of oxidation, the color varies, ranging from amber to brown and deep black. They are all referred to as "Kuro-Karatsu."



Chosen Karatsu (Korean Karatsu Ware)

Chosen Karatsu is characterized by the combination of two different glazes, an iron oxide glaze and an ash glaze, which run together freely when fired at a high temperature. In many cases, the milky white ash glaze runs down over the black iron oxide glaze

Mishima (Slip inlay decoration)

This is a technique adopted from Korean Yi Dynasty ceramics, which are called "Mishima" in Japan. In this process, floral and linear patterns are stamped or carved on the surface of the semi-dried clay, filled with a contrasting slip, and then coated with a glaze. In Karatsu, this slip inlay technique was adopted in the




Kohiki (White slip pottery)

It is a style of pottery in which the dark brown clay body is covered with a white slip and then glazed with an ash glaze before fired. This technique was adopted in modern times.

there are various other styles of Karatsu ware, such as Muji-Karatsu (plain Karatsu), Ki-Karatsu (yellow Karatsu), Ao-Karatsu (green Karatsu), Hakeme-Karatsu (brush-marked Karatsu), Hori-Karatsu (carved Karatsu), and Jakatsu-Karatsu (scaled Karatsu). They are named after their patterns and styles.





Karatsu O Mackerel has been developed as a new alternative to Yobuko Squid. Developed through industry-academia collaboration, these fully farmed, plump, tasty chub mackerel are available and fresh


