Shimabara Castle



Shimabara Castle

Matsukura Bungonokami Shigemasa took seven years from 1618 to construct Shimabara Castle. It is a magnificent castle in Azuchi-Momoyama style incorporating a five-story castle keep as a core and large and small turrets in key places.

Castle Tower and Observatory (5F)

Enjoy the historic townscape of Shimabara 360 degrees; you can view the city area of Shimabara and Mt. Mayuyama, as well as the mountains in Kumamoto Prefecture beyond the sea.



Tourist Restoration Memorial Museum

The Tourist Restoration Memorial Museum introduces the history, culture, and tourist attractions of Shimabara, including the progress of the eruption activity of Mt. Unzen.



Museum of Christian History

Museum of Christian History exhibits a large number of valuable historical materials related to the 1637 Shimabara Rebellion (largely involving Catholic peasants) and local/folk artifacts.



Seibo Memorial Hall

The Seibo Memorial Hall is an unparalleled sculpture-art gallery that exhibits about 60 original works by Seigo Kitamura, a local born in Shimabara.

Mingu Museum

Many examples of nostalgic folk tools are exhibited.

Old Samurai Houses



Old Samurai Houses

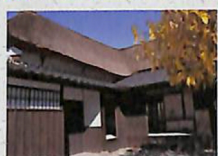
The residences of samurai (Japanese warriors), with an annual stipend of not in excess of 70 koku (1 koku = 180 l of rice, were constructed adjacent to the western outskirts of Shimabara Castle at the time Iwano built. The town is called "Tsubo-machi" (lit. a gun tower) because it was populated mainly by infantry unit members armed with guns who lived in the town during the war. Abundant spring water was diverted to the waterway in the center of the street, and it was maintained carefully for domestic use.

Shinozuka House

The Shinozuka family's head was named Junemon down through the generations. The family was originally from Mikawa's Fukuzo in Aichi Prefecture. The family line continued until early in the Meiji period (1868 - 1912) with an annual stipend of 8 to 13 koku (1 koku = 180 l) of rice for two people, and mainly worked as county secretaries or magistrates.



Yamamoto House

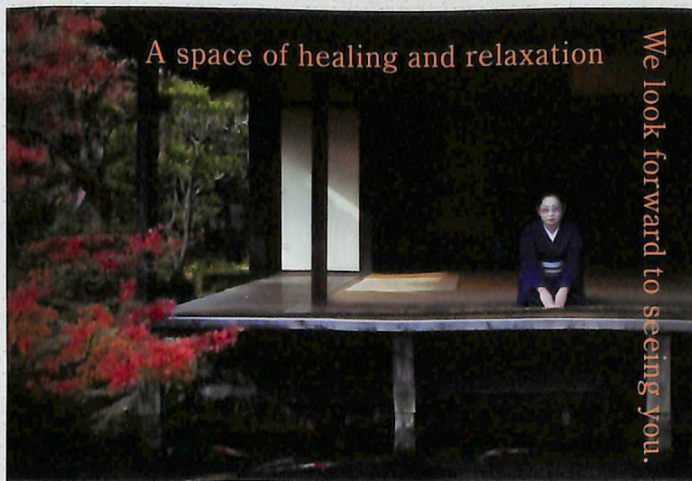
The Yamamoto family's Sogozamon the first became a vassal to Lord Matsudaira Tadonoha's father Tadatoshi (the Lord of Yoshida Castle in Mikawa, Aichi Prefecture). He served to the Matsudaira family from 1746 to 1774, and followed Tadatoshi (the fourth lord of the castle) when Tadatoshi took over the jurisdiction of Shimabara. Altogether, he served a total of 13 lords until the end of the Edo period (1868).



Torita House

The Torita family was an old family that descended from the lineage of Lord Matsudaira. The family moved to Shimabara in 1669. The whole area was occupied by middle- and lower-class samurai. Japanese warrior class residences. Each residence was on a premises of approximately 300 square meters, and its yard was planted with fruit trees, such as loquat, persimmon, and citrus.

There are three large and small ponds on the premises, where 3,000 tons of water are released every day. Shimeiso is nostalgic place where the quiet appearance, forgotten the time, and a relaxing space.

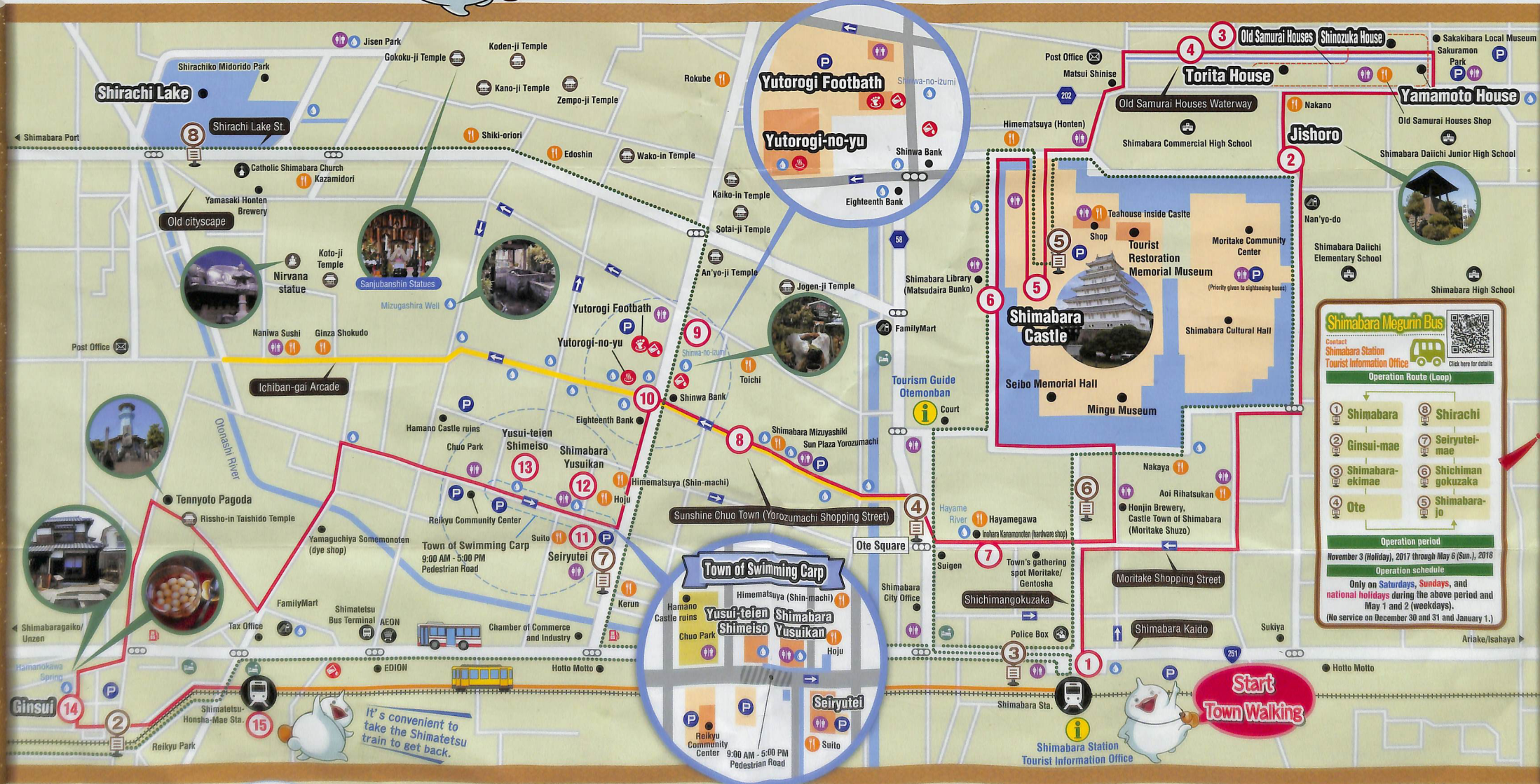
