



Kirishima Onsen Area


access About 30 min by car from Kagoshima Airport

In the heart of the Kirishima mountains that are featured in the nythological story of the gods decent to earth, from an elevation of 600m to 850m, there are nine onsen with various types of water. Many of these onsen have healing properties. Nearby are Shinrin therapy road, Maruo falls, Nunobiki falls, Senjojiki, and Kirishima's oldest open air stone bath. There are many hotels and ryokan to stay at in this "not to miss" tourist location.



There is a river next to Kirishima Shrine that starts flowing in June every year. This river dries up in around 10 days and then, after a few more, starts flowing again. This is how it got its name, "Ryoudo" (both times)

Inside an approximately 10 cm crack in a large

boulder mysterious Sanskrit lettering is engraved Who could have written in such a space too narrow for the human hand? Near Kirishima Shrine there is a stream that dries u between the months of Nov. and April. The strange thing is that every year in May it naturally starts flowing and fresh water and fish come forth together.

The unsowr seed

growing naturally even though no seeds have been sown. These crops are said to have originated from seeds brought down by the gods from the heavenly plains. It is said that in ages past, in the middle of the night, the high drone of traditional music could be heard from the main building of Kirishima Shrine... Some say even now one can hear sounds very like traditional music in the middle of the night... Midnight

This shrine enshrines Ninigi-no-Mikoto, the god who, in legend, founded the country of Japan. Said to have been built in the 6th century, it has been razed by volcanic eruptions and rebuilt repeatedly The current shrine was built by lord Shimadzu Yoshitaka in 1715.

Wake Shrine 20995-77-2885

This shrine is dedicated to Wake-no-Kiyomaru, a country official who served from the end of the Nara period to the beginning of the Heian period. Many visitors each year come to see the beautiful flowers that bloom during the Wisteria Festival, held from mid-April to early May



Miyaura-Gu Shrine Husband-and-Wife Gingko Trees

Said to have been planted to commemorate the sitting of a temporary palace here by the Emperor Jinmu. The trees are both over a thousand years old.





Mt. Takaya Landing


